The Challenge

Office vacancies soared during the COVID-19 pandemic of 2020-2021 as demand for space fell, creating obstacles to attracting new users to Downtown Lansing. The subject property has been owned and used by WMU-Cooley Law School for decades as a conference center and lecture hall, but it was built nearly 100 years ago. Addtionally, the space does not have an identified use. The current office landscape paired with the nature of the building made it difficult to secure a user who would be interested in purchasing and investing in a large space. For these reasons, the property has remained vacant for over six years.

The Solution

The Results
